




- Provided 1154 instructional hours, 25% more than the Ohio requirement for charter schools








ACADEMIC PROGRESS

Emerging from the pandemic, Lorain Preparatory Academy state testing results remained flat year-over-year. In 2022-23, some students met growth targets in Reading & Math, and 98% of students met the state reading requirement for promotion to Grade 4. The school is addressing the need for greater academic growth through faculty changes, faculty training, and efforts to further reduce the 61% rate for chronic student absenteeism.

St. Aloysius, as the sponsor of this school, is legally mandated to provide oversight, monitoring, and technical assistance. Key to the oversight, monitoring, and technical assistance is St. Aloysius' review of the school's Ohio Improvement Process (OIP) plan development and implementation. As a result of our thorough oversight and monitoring, St. Aloysius has determined that this school is substantially compliant with the rules and regulations governing commaunity schools
